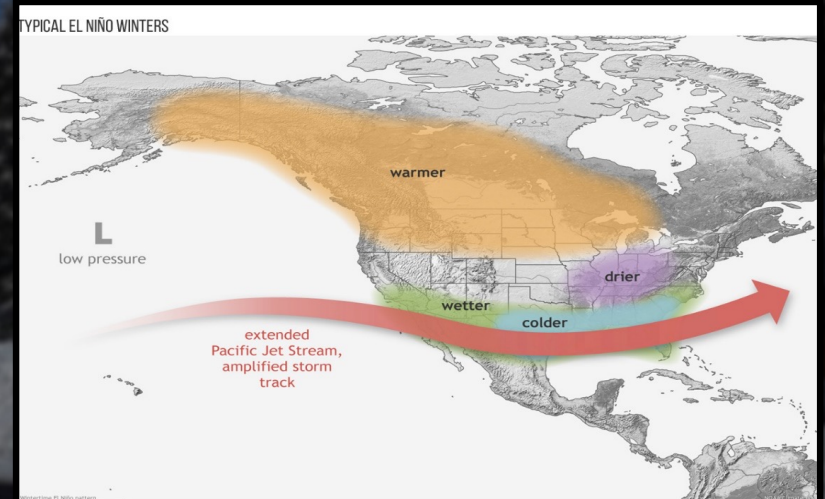
What is El Niño?

Warmer than normal water temperatures across the central/eastern Pacific Ocean.

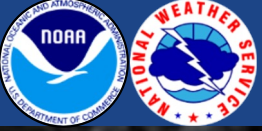


What could El Niño mean for Arizona?

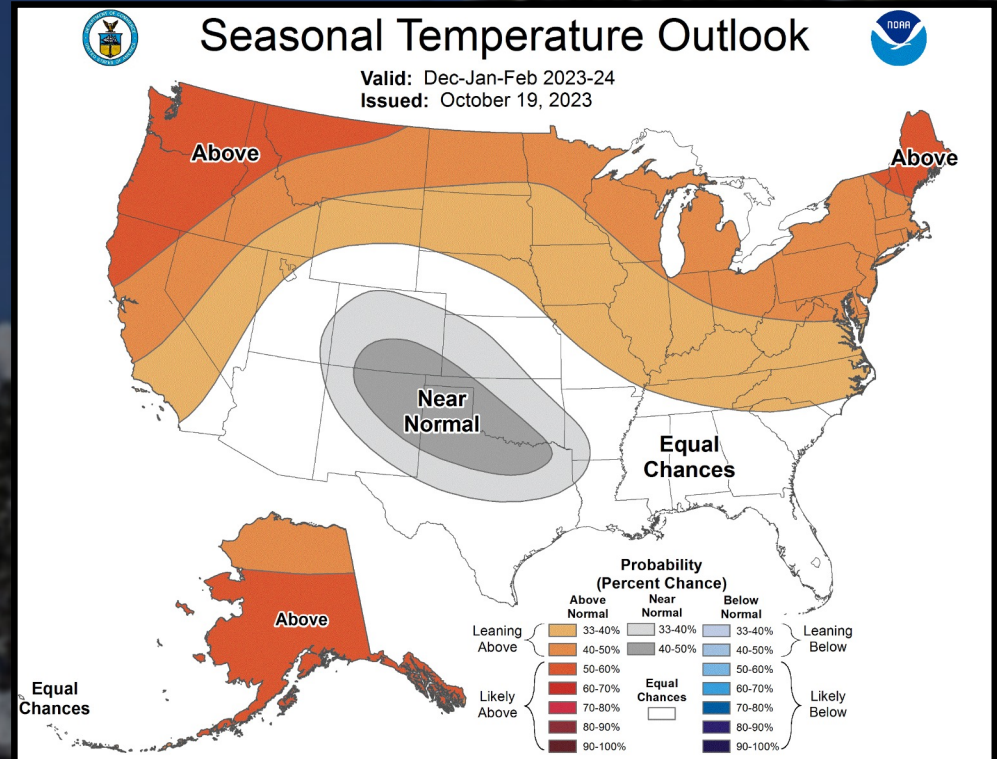
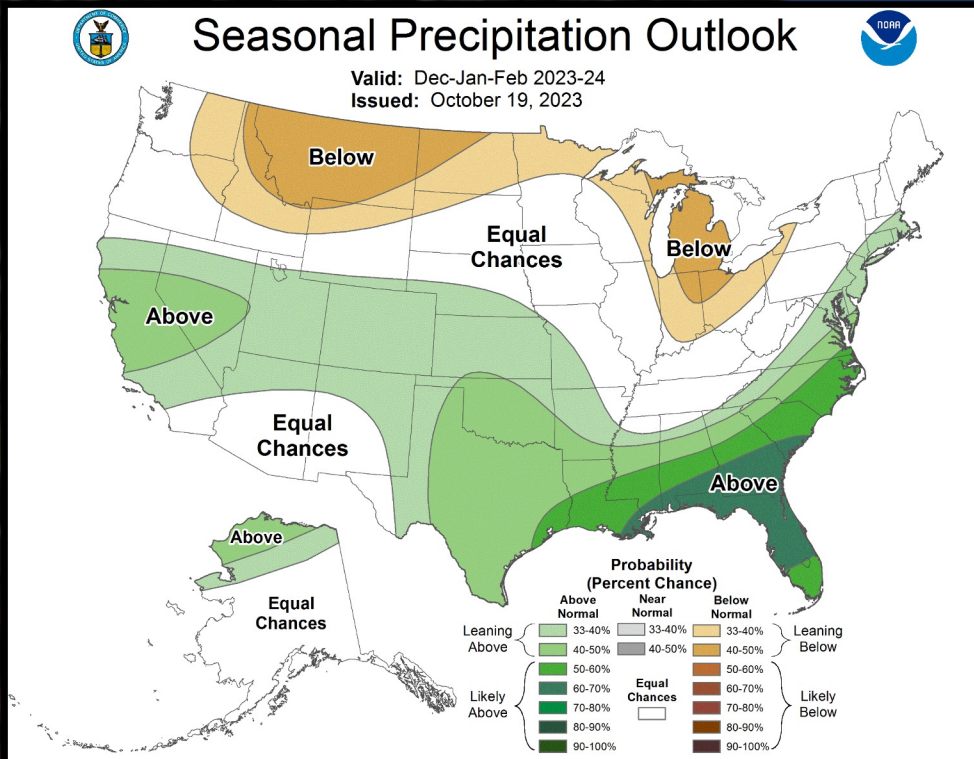
Generally a more active weather pattern which favors wetter than normal winters (not a guarantee, especially 2023-2024).



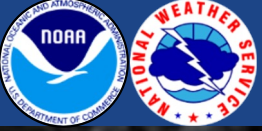
Other factors (that are hard to forecast) can influence/change these patterns and result in deviations to what's expected! Bottom line: always be prepared!



2023-2024 Winter Outlook – Precipitation & Temperatures

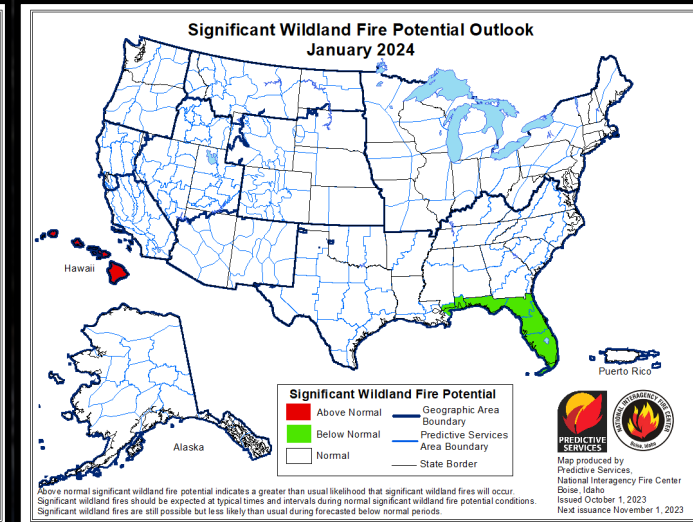
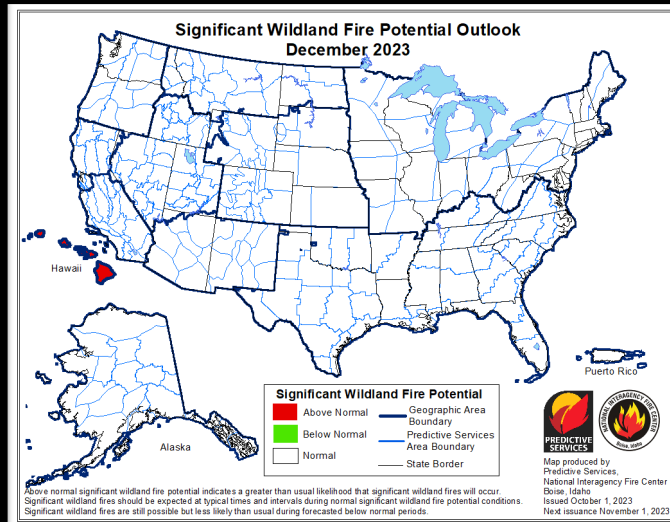
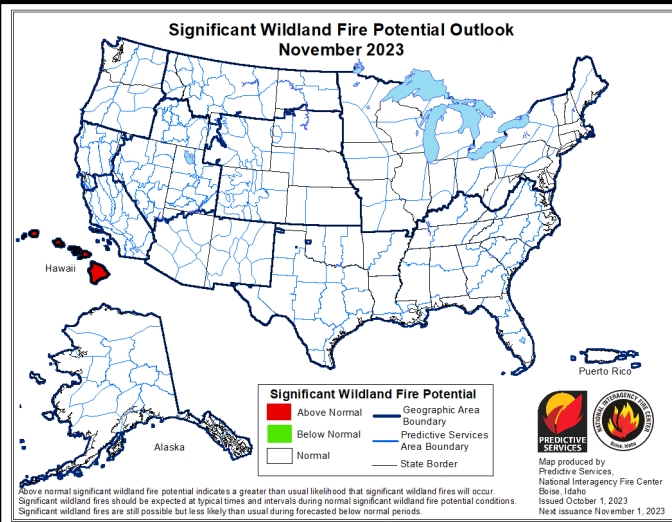


Odds slightly leaning toward above normal precipitation across northern Arizona...equal odds that precipitation and temperatures through February could be below, near normal, or above normal.

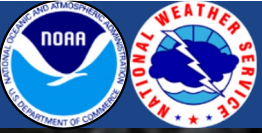


2023-2024 Winter Outlook – Significant Wildland Fire Potential

November – December – January (2024) Significant Wildland Fire Potential



Note...no shading doesn't mean NO potential. If fuels are receptive and temperatures, winds, humidity, and terrain all align—significant wildland fires can occur during the cool season!

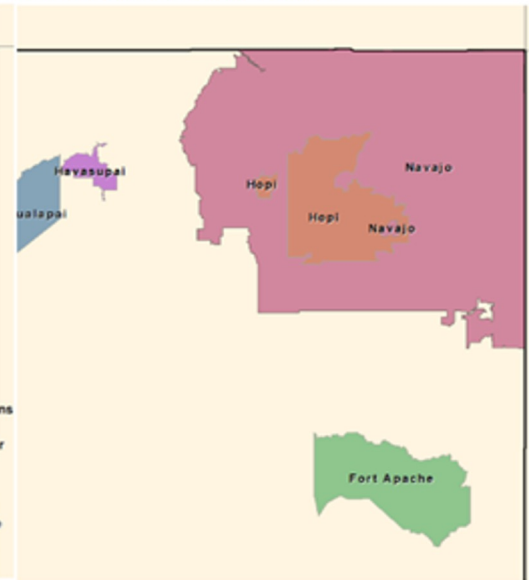
Roadway Snow Tables



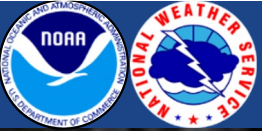
